

## God's Love Changes Everything...



Could you imagine that the business of living is sometimes like walking a tightrope in the sort of organisation or family or region you live and work in?

The secret to success in walking on a tightrope is not to fall off. If you fall off, you have no influence or recognition, and may assume that you are no longer valued, or are a failure. Sometimes we live and work in places where other people nudge or push to destabilise

us – where the competitive or controlling spirit is so strong that they would be glad to see us fall as they strive to achieve their own agenda or promotion. In other places or times, cynicism can make us feel as though we want to jump off, and withdraw from that community altogether. We find ourselves living in a spirit of Fear.

Sometimes a procedure or compassion operates to catch people who are falling, or to repair damage after someone has fallen. In many cases, the organisation acts to protect itself without regard to the health and well being of the individual. Our social system is a bit like that. People who act in a way that is harmful to the community are physically separated, partly to protect the community and partly as punishment for the offence. We simply don't have any other way to deal with people who fall, are pushed, or jump off the tightrope of our cultural expectations.

Jesus suggests that we help each other to keep our balance, to stop people from falling in the first place. It involves being authentic, transforming, reliable, effective, relating, encouraging, developing and compassionate. It means living in the spirit of Love —putting the needs of the person next to us before our own. Not easy. But how can we demonstrate the benefits of living in His Kingdom to people who don't know about it, if we don't really live there ourselves? Could a sheep dog convince a sheep to become a shepherd?

During his recent visit to Australia, I heard Philip Yancy ask people in his audiences to think about what "success" really means to us. He spoke about the big, glossy picture that our culture worships, and how tempting it is to be lured into a lifestyle that gives credence to money, fame, power etc being the only real benchmarks of success. Who do we think about as being 'Successful'? What absorbs most of our time and energy? Is there enough room on the tightrope for everyone? What lies at the foundation of our day to day perceptions, choices and behaviour?

In the November December edition of Everyday with Jesus Subtitled "The Great Divide", Selwyn Hughes is quoted :

*Love battles without equal in enemy territory.*

*What defence has evil's raw destructive rage against Jehovah's pure sacrificial love?*

*Love speaks a different language and marches on a different plane.*

*Evil parades avenging power, roaring deceit and darkness, sin and separation and finally eternal death.*

*Love descends to earth's manger, yields to sin's cross then bursts from death's grave in victorious eternal life.*



# Follow the Leader

Jesus said,

*"I am the good shepherd.  
The good shepherd lays down his  
life for the sheep"*

(John 10:11 NIV).

Christ was the Master Shepherd, and He calls us to follow Him. If we are to be Christ-like, we must be like a shepherd. Here are some of the qualities of the Biblical shepherd (adapted from *The Minister as Shepherd* by Charles Jefferson)

1. A watchman – circumspect, attentive and vigilant. He couldn't afford to be apathetic or self-seeking. The safety and nurture of the sheep came first. (c.f. the hired hand Jn10:12).

2. A guard, ever ready to defend his sheep. The sheep is defenceless, entirely reliant on the shepherd. However assured people appear, they may in reality be quite insecure.

3. A guide - the shepherd cannot drive the sheep; he/she must lead them. The sheep know that it is safe to follow the shepherd and will go where the shepherd leads. The shepherd should always go in advance of the sheep, leading from the front, and by example.

4. The Jewish shepherd was a physician, caring about the sheep's total state of health. The Christian shepherd cares for physical, mental, emotional and spiritual needs of the sheep.

5. A saviour – ever ready to help the sheep cope with a difficult situation, either personally or by referral or calling on others.

6. Feeding the sheep is vital, and an essential duty of the shepherd. The health and success of the sheep depends on proper feeding.

7. The Eastern shepherd truly loved the sheep, a concept that is difficult for Western culture to understand. He (she) called them by name, carried the lambs lovingly, communicated, played, and even talked with the sheep.

# Caring for Ex-Offenders

Over 80 people from 9 different churches around Adelaide met in October for the first Australian training day in Alpha's Caring for Ex-Offenders program.

"It is wonderful to see churches taking up the challenge to minister to these people, especially as they leave prison and make the crucial adjustment back into society. The training day certainly helped to equip Churches for this task", said Rev Bill Reddin, Principal Chaplain, Prison Chaplaincy Services SA.

Alpha Australia is introducing the Caring for Ex-Offenders program into Australia with the aim of the reintegration of ex-offenders back into society through the local church. This program has been developed in the UK and found to be effective in Canada, the USA, South Africa and Singapore.

The program (see [www.alpha.org.au](http://www.alpha.org.au)) aims to equip churches to reintegrate into society an offender who wants to be part of a church upon their release. The process involves churches creating four person teams to address different aspects of an ex-offenders reintegration needs. Churches are advised to encourage the ex-offender in rehabilitation programs using the various organisations, secular and Christian, which work with ex-offenders in practical, vocational, educational and behaviour management aspects of rehabilitation.

The training is conducted over two days and involves input from Prison Authorities, Chaplains, churches with experience in the area, Ex-Offenders, experts in rehabilitation and prison ministry workers.

"Our vision is of a network of Caring for Ex-Offender equipped churches in every region of Australia effectively helping ex-offenders reintegrate into society", said John Clarke, Alpha's National Coordinator, Alpha for Prisons. "Many churches are already doing this, but most want to do it more effectively."

Alpha hopes to shortly have sufficient interest from churches to conduct a first day's training in Sydney in early 2008. Kairos with its experience in prison ministry and work with the families of prisoners is well placed to be involved with the introduction of Caring for Ex-Offenders.

Who are your sheep? This is a vital question, and you may well be surprised to discover who your sheep are. They may include friends in green, Kairos acquaintances and fellow team members. Don't forget any committees or volunteer groups you work with. Beyond Kairos, you may be a shepherd in the workplace, the home, the neighbourhood, or in society in general. If we truly give ourselves to Jesus, we need to take on the mantle of shepherd. I challenge you to seriously consider this. But a word of warning- sheep bite.

Be prepared, but don't give up. Jesus didn't. Neither rejection, abuse or persecution put Him off. We must not allow negative reception or response to deter us. Remember the Holy Spirit, our most valuable aid – ever with us to strengthen and equip.

Now hear these words as from Jesus,–

*"I am the Good Shepherd. I watch, I guard, I guide, I heal, I rescue, I feed. I love from the beginning, and I love to the end. Follow me!"*

David Kennedy said that a bequest was coming to Kairos from a friend of his who had passed away and he suggested that this be given to KO#1 which was passed by the committee. This amounted to \$5000! **Wow** God sure wanted KO to be held.*

An awareness day was held in Nov 2006 with Robyn Morris and Margaret Fuller, about 50 ladies and a few men who turned up all eager to hear what KO was about. Next we held an advance-training day in Jan 2007 and approximately 30 ladies attended.

With God's guidance, we started choosing a team and what a beautiful group of spirit filled ladies they were, coming

from all walks of life. Then 9<sup>th</sup> November the big day had dawned, we went to Galong loaded to the hilt with all we needed to run this weekend. Galong is 1 1/2 hours away from Junee so it was a mammoth job getting all our gear there, 100 shoe boxes included, We started setting up, guest numbers had gone down but I was praying that God would send just those that needed to come.

We were all so excited and as it turned out 2 extra ladies came along!!

The candle lighting was beautiful, 13 ladies came, as guests and I would say 13 were touched and the seed planted. Our extra ladies were God chosen, each one expressing the need to have our Lord in their lives and wanting to find churches that would accept them. We are now forming groups for these ladies to attend.

We saw 13 scared ladies arrive and 13 radiant ladies with Jesus on their faces go home, it is now up to us to support, encourage and love God's precious girls.

Our first Reunion will be December 1, and our KO Riverina #2 weekend will be held November 14-16, 2008 with Lorraine Robinson as Leader.

# Are you a well balanced Christian with a heart for youth?

*The Torch arm of Kairos may be the next exciting challenge on your faith Journey. Feel your too old to relate to youth? Don't worry team training will have you thinking like a teenager again in no time.*

## **Background**

A Torch program runs for two & a half days. During this time the Torch team introduces the residents (ages approximately 16 to 24 years) to Christian concepts as a means of making better choices for their lives. The Torch program is designed to encourage the participants to remove their masks and develop a mature means of making better choices, thus building their self esteem. The boys are encouraged to realise their potential through creation of a safe environment, allowing them to learn what life can be like in a loving, caring and trusting community. The initial program is followed up by an established mentoring program.

## **Currently**

Torch is only offered at the Frank Baxter Juvenile Justice Centre at Kariang on the Central Coast of NSW. The Torch program is also suitable for adult prisons where many young offenders are being accommodated. John Morony #1 at Richmond is a good prospect for this ministry.

## **History**

Torch #1 at the Frank Baxter Centre was conducted in April 2001. To date 167 boys have been blessed in attending a Torch program. Approximately one third of the youth incarcerated in the state of NSW reside at the Baxter Centre. We enjoy the use of wonderful mod-

ern facilities which includes a large gym that is ideal for our closing ceremonies. Our Chaplain Ramsay Nuthall does an excellent job with the boys plus supporting the Torch program. Management and staff at the Baxter Centre are also very supportive of our Ministry.

## **Opportunities for 2008**

Torch #11 at the Baxter Centre will be held during April 2008. Married couples plus mature women (mother / grandmother figures) make a great contribution to this ministry. However we are particularly anxious to recruit young men 20/30s age group. Also we need men with leadership qualities who could lead future programs. For travel convenience locals from the Central coast are our target area however people in the Hornsby area find it a comfortable trip along the expressway to Kariang.

We hope to have talks with Management at John Morony #1 soon to discuss the prospect of Torch at that Corrective Services Centre. Your prayers would be appreciated here.

If you feel you have a calling for a great faith experience with youth, I would be happy to speak with you.

# “The Golden Compass” Pointing in the Wrong Direction

The Kairos community is dedicated to being a light to a world that is lost amongst darkness, we wish to promote the Cause of Christ and tell his people that there is a God in Heaven who loves them.

With our society dominated by technology and the media it is now more important than ever to filter what we will and will not allow into our minds and hearts. Especially the hearts and minds of our children.

There will be a new children’s movie out in December called “The Golden Compass”. The website listed below contains the following information regarding the movie.

*“The Golden Compass”. The movie has been described as “atheism for kids” and is based on the first book of a trilogy entitled “His Dark Materials” that was written by Phillip Pullman. Pullman is a militant atheist and secular humanist who despises C. S. Lewis and the “Chronicles of Narnia”. His motivation for writing this trilogy was specifically to counteract Lewis’ symbolisms of Christ that are portrayed in the Narnia series.*

*While “The Golden Compass” movie itself may seem mild and innocent, the books are a much different story. In the trilogy, a young streetwise girl becomes enmeshed in an epic struggle to ultimately defeat the oppressive forces of a senile God. Another character, an ex-nun, describes Christianity as “a very powerful and convincing mistake.” In the final book, characters representing Adam and Eve eventually kill*

*God, who at times is called YAHWEH. Each book in the trilogy gets progressively worse regarding Pullman’s hatred of Jesus Christ.*

“The Golden Compass” is set to premier on December 7, during the Christmas season (and starring Nicole Kidman), and will probably be heavily advertised. Promoters hope that unsuspecting parents will take their children to see the movie, that they will enjoy the movie, and that the children will want the books for Christmas.”

Whilst we acknowledge it is up to the discretion of the parent/ grandparent/ godparent as whether or not you will allow your children to see this movie, we do ask that you please consider a boycott of the movie and the books. If you would like more information about the movie you


